# Caring Together Program Supports Community Members Living with HIV

# 2024 Outcomes

**646** medical patients served: **69** new

31 people newly diagnosed as compared to 26 in 2023

**\$259,913** spent on financial assistance and supportive services

**80.9%** of patients retained in medical care (national benchmark 80%)

**89.8%** of patients virally suppressed (*national* benchmark 90%)

In 1991, Family First Health began receiving Ryan White federal funding to provide HIV care. Ten years later, in 2001, Caring Together (CT) was formed to create a seamless system of high quality services and support for our patients. This included the start of a partnership with the WellSpan Community Health Center to provide additional medical care.

In addition to offering comprehensive medical care, we also offer CT consumers case management services at four office locations: York (FFH George Street Center and WellSpan Community Heatlh Center), Hanover, and Gettysburg.

FFH is fortunate to have great staff to supporting this program. We have three medical providers caring for our patients: Dr. Asceline Go, Nicole Durham, CRNP, and Lisa DeWees, CRNP. All three are credentialed as HIV Specialists through the American Academy of HIV Medicine. There are four case managers and three clinical care coordinators to support our providers. We also have a clinical pharmacist, Dr. Natalie Crouse, PharmD, BCPS, AAHIVP., and a nutritionist Dr. Bailey Corbin-Marrah, RDN, LDN., on site.

Our services for this program are varied, and offer comprehensive support for our consumers. Here are just a few of the supports we offer:

- Primary HIV medical care
- Clinical care coordination
- Nutritionist and pharmacist consultations
- Transportation, housing, and utility assistance
- Food, nutritional supplements, and prescription drug assistance
- Insurance applications, assistance with co-pays, deductibles, and premiums
- Risk reduction education and supplies


# Making a Difference: A Proactive Approach with **Caring Together**

In addition to medical care and case management services, Caring Together takes a proactive approach to supporting community members by offering free, confidential rapid HIV testing. No appointment is necessary for our walk-in hours at the George Street Center (Monday through Friday, 8:30 am -3:30 pm) and at various events in the community. Last year the program completed 510 tests through this program, from which three people were confirmed positive.

Our Caring Together program averages 9 new enrollments each month. This includes, but is not limited to, newly diagnosed individuals, self-referrals, and transfers. We work closely with the York City Bureau of Health, PA Department of Health, prisons, hospitals, and primary care offices to assure a smooth transition to our program.

In 1996, York City dedicated a Garden of Serenity and Hope as a memorial for those lost to AIDS and in honor of those living with HIV/AIDS. This beautiful garden is located in Albemarle Park in York City. Every year, we host recognition events at the garden in conjunction with World AIDS Day on December 1.

## Who is Ryan White?

FFH receives Ryan White funding to support the Caring Together Program and is named in honor of the teenage boy who contracted AIDS after receiving a blood transfusion in 1984. Ryan became a symbol of the AIDS epidemic, particularly for his courageous fight against discrimination and for his advocacy for better care and access for people living with HIV/AIDS. Ryan White Funding is available across the United States.

- Catch us at **First Friday** on May 2nd! We'll have a table of fun, family-friendly activities and information about our school-based health center on N. Beaver Street during First Friday in downtown York. Come see us between 5:00 and 8:00 pm.

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
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
